Laura Ingalls Wilder was born in 1867 in Pepin, Wisconsin. Her father was always trying to give his family a better life, so they moved many times while Laura was growing up. Some of the states she lived in were Wisconsin, Missouri, Kansas, Iowa, Minnesota, and South Dakota. Laura had many adventures growing up as a pioneer girl. She started writing about these experiences when she was 65. Her books have sold about 60 million copies and have been translated into at least 15 languages. Laura died in 1957 in Missouri at the farm where she and her husband Almonzo lived. There are several museums in the various places the Ingalls family lived over the years, including one in Pepin.
