THE MILWAUKEE COUNTY COUNCIL OF STAMP CLUBS

TRAVELING TROPHY AWARD

The Milwaukee County Council of Stamp Clubs in a meeting on March 4th, 1946, voted that the Milwaukee County Council Traveling Cup be awarded for one year to the member club of the W.F.S.C. winning the most points in accordance with the schedule appearing on page two of this bulletin.

Where an exhibitor winning points is a bonafide (paid-up) member of more than one W.F.S.C. club, each such club shall be credited equally with the full point winning of the member.

Permanent possession of the cup shall pass to the first W.F.S.C. club to win the cup three times.

It was also voted that some premium in point values should be given to the smaller clubs in order to stimulate competition for the cup. (The handicap schedule appearing on page two of this bulletin was then adopted.)

The Milwaukee County Council of Stamp Clubs Traveling Cup was first put into competition at Green Bay in 1946.
