MESSAGE FROM SWRVP, H. C. Koeppen

The SouthWest Region continues to be the show district of the Federation. Two of the five clubs are planning on their annual spring shows, while a third club is hosting a national show.

The Rockford Stamp Club will hold their annual show at the Faust Hotel in downtown Rockford on April 6th & 7th. The show will include a 50-frame exhibit and the usual 12 bourse tables. Two weeks later, April 20 & 21, the Janesville Show will be held at the Labor Temple in downtown Janesville. This show will also contain 50 frames of material and 11 bourse dealers.

The Preble Chapter of the Universal Ship Cancellation Society will host the Society's Annual Convention and Exhibition at the Quality Courts Motel (Junction I-90 and U.S. 12 & 18) in Madison. The show dates are June 29th & 30th. A 100-frame exhibit from many of the nationally known ship cover collections will be on display. A small bourse will also be available. An 85-lot auction of donated covers will take place on Saturday morning.

All three shows will sponsor cachets. Rockford's depicts 150 years of Illinois Statehood with a nationally known artist presentation. Janesville will depict the 100th anniversary of the Impeachment Trial of President Andrew Johnson. The Preble cachet will show the 170th anniversary of Congressional authorization of an additional 12 ships for the U.S. Navy. Details of these covers can be obtained from the individual stamp club stories in this bulletin.

All the clubs of the region continue to hold monthly meetings. Attendance is usually excellent. All are planning on seeing you in Appleton on May 18th & 19th.

TOPEX '68 welcomes all stamp collectors to exhibit in the 17th annual exhibition to be held at the Sheraton-Schroeder Hotel, Milwaukee, from June 21 to 23, 1968. The show is open class as all exhibits are topical in nature following the definition for topicals listed on the prospectus. The nine-page Illinois frames will be used and the maximum number of frames per entry is five. The fee per frame is \$3.00. Junior exhibits will use the four-page Wisconsin frames at a fee of \$1.00 per frame, and a maximum of three frames per exhibit. Entries close May 1st. ATA NEW RELEASE - Animals on Stamps is the title of topical stamp handbook no. 62 distributed by the American Topical Association, 8,000-member-collectors' society. This 400 page profusely illustrated 1968 catalog covers the complete field of zoology: animals, birds (ornithology), butterflies, insects (entomology), mammals, fish & sea life. It's the most comprehensive work of its kind ever published in English. The original work has gone through three successful editions in German by Hans Strom. This, the first English edition, co-edited by Mrs. L.H. Lewy, has a striking front cover with animal stamps in full natural colors. A special section on art paper shows typical examples of mounting album pages. After a helpful introduction loaded with suggestions and guidelines for the proper, most rewarding approach to an Animals on Stamps collection, follow the four major sections of the book, all of which are fully cross-referenced. The main section by far is the catalog by countries of issuance. Each listing includes year issued, purpose of issue, denomination, name of animal in Latin and English and reference number of the animal group (in the Register by Systems) to which this species belongs. Extinct varieties are specifically noted. Non-Scott issues included. The second major section of over 100 pages, the "Register by Systems of Stamps Showing Animals" has been subdivided and arranged scientifically by phyla, classes, orders, families, and species without however forcing the stamp collector to go into these too deeply. After each species appear the countries in the first catalog section which show it on their stamps. Two final cross-referenced sections, the Alphabetical indexes of Latin & English names again give the reference number (in the Register by Systems) for ease in locating any animal. Well worth \$10 if printed in the USA, but due to the economies of foreign printing, Animals on Stamps handbook is being offered for just \$6 from American Topical Association, 3300 N. 50th St., Milwaukee, Wis., 53216. A free sample copy of Topical Time will be sent with orders.

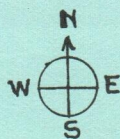

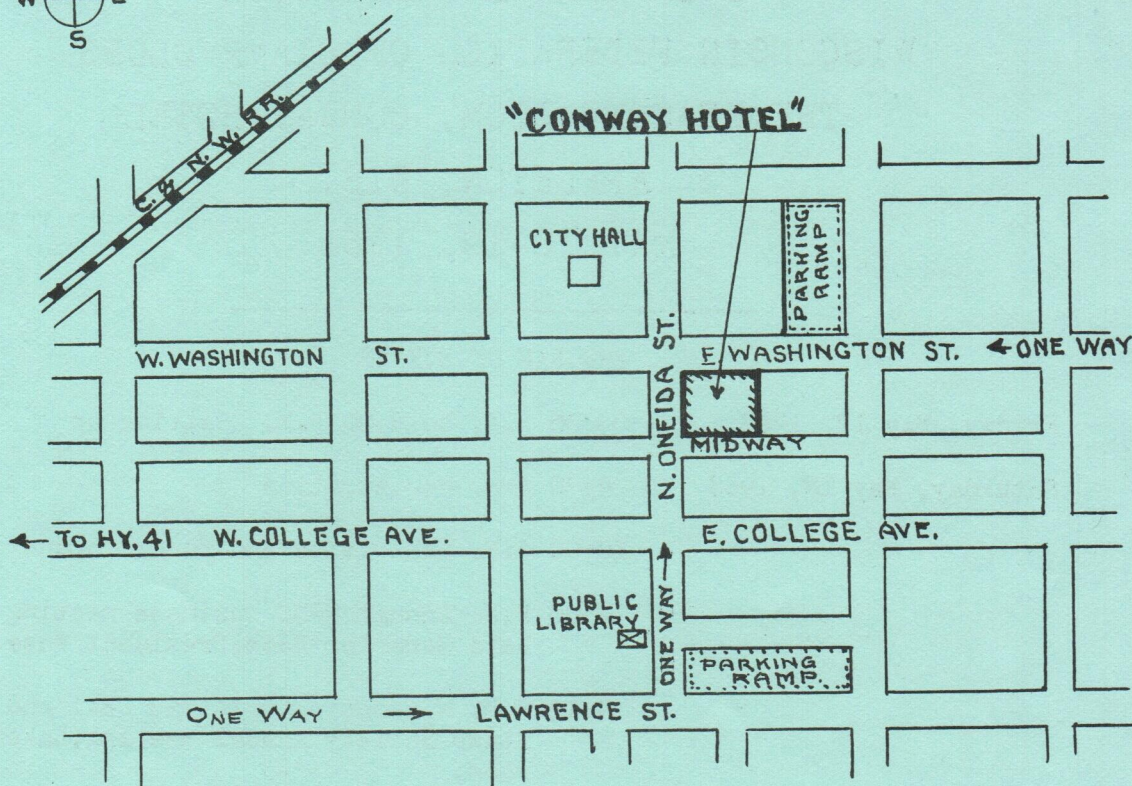

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING EXHIBITS

1. Exhibitors must be members in good standing of a WFSC member club which is in good standing, except Juniors who must be sponsored by a member.
2. All material exhibited must be the property of the exhibitor and must be authentic.
3. All exhibits must be mounted on album pages, unless too large.
